Hepatitis B and hepatitis C elimination pledge: Together we can end viral hepatitis by 2030.

All Victorians living with hepatitis B and hepatitis C should be provided with the healthcare they need in the way they want to be well and stay well, no matter who they are or where they live.

There is a cure for hepatitis C.
There is an effective treatment for hepatitis B.

Yet, many people living with hepatitis B and C continually experience stigma and discrimination. As a result, hospitals and many other health services do not feel safe or accessible. This means they don't get the care they need to treat hepatitis and keep their liver healthy.

Hepatitis B and C do not have to lead to liver cirrhosis, liver cancer, or early, preventable death – but too often they do.

Victoria has made good progress towards eliminating hepatitis B and hepatitis C as public health threats by 2030. To get there, we need to take what's already working in pockets of Victoria and make it work everywhere it's needed.

To reach elimination in the next 5 years, we need to ensure people living with hepatitis B and hepatitis C can access treatment and care in their community – and end the stigma and discrimination they face.

I pledge to stand with people living with hepatitis B and hepatitis C in my community and support more accessible treatment and care locally.
